St.Mary's Church

I've been a-visiting. It is not something I have been able to do for a long time, so it is a treat to be back to wandering around Dorset and dropping in on people. It is an essential part of being a country vicar and I have missed it, so it is nice to be back. And it has reminded me of some things. It has reminded me of what a privilege it is to live in such a beautiful part of the world. The gently rolling hills of Dorset look grand clothed with lush spring growth and a carpet of spring flowers. Every turn a new vista, every glance a new surprise. Bluebells poking out from beneath the trees. The smell of wild garlic creeping in through the open window. Even the enforced slowness of travel is a gift. You cannot rush Dorset roads, so you have time to acknowledge those who wait for you and wave thanks to those who let you through. It has also reminded me of how welcoming Dorset folk are.

Of course, some are too busy to stop and chat. As I tend to stop on the off chance, only calling ahead if I know I have to check, it is not surprising if I catch someone mid phone call and are gently asked to pop back later. I never mind. It's the human contact that matters not the length of the conversation. Many seem to be happy to catch a moment to natter, a breather from a busy day, a chance to catch up after so many months

of enforced isolation. For me it is always a privilege to be welcomed, one of the great privileges of being a country vicar.

And what do I do between stops? Well, I catch up with my Bible in One Year podcast. I offer to God the countryside and its residents. I listen to one of my favourite radio 4 comedy programmes. Or I just enjoy the experience of being a little bit more normal. Not the new normal that we hear so much about, but the old normal. The one where neighbourliness is natural and easy, where prayer is simply a part of being alive, where love from God and love from friends mingles so that you can hardly tell the difference.

I started our worship last Sunday - Second Sunday in St Andrew's School - with this Bible verse: 'People of Israel, return to the Lord...that he may return to you who are left, who have escaped'. As I wander around I feel a little bit like an escapee, remembering with sorrow those left behind, but glad to be out and able to return to the Lord - to gather, to visit, to pray, to worship - and very grateful for God's promise that as I return to the Lord, the Lord will return to me.

"Ultrafast" or "Ultraslow" Broadband? "Ultraslow"

MP Chris Loder writes to ask us to complete his survey if your connectivity is particularly poor:

"Two weeks ago, the Government confirmed Dorset's inclusion in the £5 billion Project Gigabit broadband programme, which I lobbied hard for. We also have several Community Fibre Partnerships (CFPs) active in West Dorset and I have been working closely with Openreach on these.

As I continue my campaign to get good broadband connectivity across West Dorset, I need to collate the specific details of where connectivity is particularly poor. I have created a survey on my website for this purpose: www.chrisloder.co.uk/broadbandsurvey. "

Bradford Abbas Ultrafast Community Project

Following on from Chris Loder's message above, the UK government has extended its offer to pay Openreach to connect our premises to the internet by fibre optic cable. As of May 2021, 90% of the target has been achieved so we need to have a few more people to pledge their vouchers so that they can go from a typical 20 Mbps now, to a possible <u>900 Mbps</u>!

- It doesn't cost anything to pledge at https://www.openreach.com/connect-my-community
- Your pledge attracts £1,500 (or £3,500 for a business) of government money paid to Openreach.
- Should the Bradford Abbas Ultrafast Community Project meet its target, people making the pledge are expected to connect to the internet via service providers like BT, Sky, EE, etc.

We're *almost* but not quite there yet! Openreach needs just a few more of us to sign up.
