# **Yeovil Railway Centre at Yeovil Junction**

Easter 2023, Easter Sunday and Easter Monday: Steam Train rides with our Peckett 0-4-0 *Pectin* as well as an Easter Bunny and an Easter Egg Hunt. Passengers travel in our coach which is accessible with a standard size wheelchair Train rides start at 11.00am and run every 20 minutes with a break for lunch for both humans and Pectin. There are turntable demonstrations at 12.40pm and 2.30pmAdmission £!3.75 for adults with Gift Aid, otherwise £12.50 for children aged 5 -15 £6.60 (gift aid), otherwise £6. One child admitted free with a full paying adult. Under 5's and members are free. No booking, just pay at the gate.

We have a shop, light refreshments, model railway layout and rides on the miniature railway (included in your entrance charge. There are exhibits and displays including the Chard Signalling Panel, see how trains are controlled. Parking is included (subject to availability)
